This year the beginning of Lent, marked by Ash Wednesday, falls on February 14th - Valentine's Day. This last happened in 2018, and just like that year, people across my social media feeds are once again wondering how to manage celebrating the people they love alongside the beginning of Lent (and the fasting that many people undertake as a spiritual practice during that time). People have asked, mostly in jest, if they should purchase that heart-shaped box of chocolate for their sweetie or forgo the treats for a more somber celebration. A few people have even designed some very silly, very funny Ash Wednesday/Valentine's Day cards that I saw being shared on Facebook. They say things like:

"Hey Valentine - Remember your mortality."

"Valentines are red/Wednesday's ashes are gray/you can't spell valentine/without 'Lent' on this day."

"Ashes to Ashes/Dust to Dust/If you're not my valentine/my Lent will be crushed."

"Hey, Girl, Let me be there 4 U while U contemplate UR mortality."

"You know the martyrdom of St. Valentine was actually pretty gruesome,

so this Ash Wednesday date is kind of appropriate."

That is certainly one creative way to bridge the gap between these two holidays that on the surface seem pretty different. Though I happen to find a few more connections between the days, but they don't fit so easily on a greeting card.

Valentine's Day is most often marketed as a day for a very specific kind of romantic love, a fairly narrow version that ignores many of the realities of human life and relationships. To have Ash Wednesday fall on the same day this year both tempers the excess of the day and widens the scope of love. Remember, God's love is for all. God's love is the root of our connectedness. And Jesus said love, the love of God and love of neighbor, is the center and foundation of our spiritual journey and faith. On Ash Wednesday, all of us at the service are marked with ash, and we are blessed with these words, "Remember, you are God's beloved dust, and to dust you shall return."

The ones we love are both beloved and fleeting. May we always remember to embrace both the love and the great responsibility of our humanness. We are created in love. We are called to live out our whole lives in love.

The season of Lent is a time of reconnection and renewal of our commitment to live in and with Christ. While this season is often associated with suffering (fasting from something we like), we might also associate it with the kinds of sacrifice and intentional focus on our faith and spirituality that lead to a fuller, deeper connection with Christ. This kind of sacrifice and intentionality is born out of love, not shame. For to some extent, Lent does need to be about pain. It does need to be about commitment, repentance, and a willingness to change – and it's pretty hard to love, or at least love well, without those things.

I hope this season helps us to rest more deeply in Christ's love. I also hope we can discern more ways to live out this love in our daily lives. We are dust. We will return to dust. In the middle, we will love.



Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. As in years past, we are partnering with Corning United Methodist Church to offer Ashes to Go and an evening worship service. The Ash Wednesday worship service will be on the 14th at 7:00 p.m. at First Presbyterian with Pastor Jessica preaching. Ashes to Go will be offered on the 14th as well. Pastors LeAnn and Jessica will be in front of Lone Arranger Noon-1:00 p.m. and at Backgrounds 1:00-2:00 p.m.

For our Lenten series, we'll be working with the book *The Lives We Actually Have: 100 Blessings for Imperfect Days* by Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie. A devotional guide is provided and available to pick up in the foyer.

Not quite two years ago, in May 2022, the Capital Campaign Committee presented information detailing the goals of a 5-year capital campaign. At that time there were several large projects that needed attention that were more than the annual budget could withstand - an HVAC system to service the sanctuary, new signage for the exterior of the church, upgraded technology, and upkeep and maintenance on the stained-glass windows. These projects had a total estimated cost of \$100,000, which was our goal for the campaign.

In August 2022, we were able to announce that between one-time gifts and pledges we had met and exceeded our goal of \$100,000. With that, we began seeking bids and negotiating work on each of the projects.

The HVAC system was installed in October 2022 and we are seeing benefits from it in lower utility bills. The new signage also went up that fall. It took more time for the upgraded technology and upkeep on the stained-glass windows to be done. The new audio, video, and streaming system was installed November 2023 and we are continuing to learn the best ways to utilize this technology. Finally, the new protective coverings for the stained-glass windows, along with some minor repairs and cleaning, were installed and completed on January 19, 2024.

Which means all four of our capital campaign projects are complete!

Due to your generous gifts, memorial gifts, and a grant from the Presbytery, all four projects have been completely paid for without incurring any debt!

All excess funds, that were not needed to pay for these four projects, will remain in the Special Building Fund and be used for future building and property needs.

The heating and cooling equipment that services the sanctuary is needing to be replaced. This will replace that portion of the HVAC system.


